Community information from Haninge municipality for residents of Brandbergen

During the period from the autumn of 2013 to the winter of 2015, Haninge municipality, in cooperation with residents and businesses in Brandbergen, has compiled a development programme.

This describes our common goals for the future of the area. The programme provides the foundations for future detailed planning and development work in this part of the municipality.

Below is a summary of the guidelines adopted by Haninge's municipal council on 21 March 2016.

Guidelines for green areas and water

- Contact with nature in Brandbergen, Tyrestakilen with its National Park and nature reserve, Forsla kärr and Skutan is reinforced.
- The vulnerable green area linking Hanvedenkilen and Tyrestakilen is protected. Any changes will be designed in a manner that minimises impact on the natural and recreational value of the area and its function as a dispersion corridor.
- Surface water is detained and purified in order to minimise pollution of Drevviken.

Guidelines for recreational areas

- There will be a clearer hierarchy for paths and cycle routes in Brandbergen, and main areas will receive priority when it comes to restoration.
- Availability and accessibility for pedestrians and cyclists will be improved in Brandbergen.
- In order to strengthen contact between Brandbergen and the regional centre of Haninge, new links will be developed between the municipal areas of Brandbergen and Handen.

Guidelines for traffic and communications

- Klockarleden and Brandbergsleden will be developed to city streets.
- Traffic infrastructure will be reviewed and developed primarily to meet the needs of pedestrians and cyclists in order to rein-

force sustainable travel.

- An extension of Söderbyleden through the vulnerable green link will take full consideration of the high natural value of this area.

Guidelines for daily life

- The multicultural character of Brandbergen is affirmed and reinforced in the plans for future developments.
- One main aim is for good folk health.
- Safety and accessibility will be improved by implementing joint efforts and developing the physical environment.
- The number of meeting places and leisure activities will be increased.
- Brandberg school continues to develop to become the natural choice of school for families in Brandbergen.
- Brandbergen's business parks will be developed and will offer plots of land to new businesses and enterprises that in turn will create new jobs.

Guidelines for the centre of Brandbergen

- The centre of Brandbergen, at the very heart of the town, will be developed to create a meeting place for all inhabitants.
- New, attractive, accessible and functional connections for buses will be developed at the station in Brandbergen centre.

Guidelines for development of residential properties

- Infill shall provide space where there is a lack of residential properties.
- The form of tenure for new residential properties shall also remain varied in order to provide equal opportunities.
- New buildings will receive priority within areas set aside for development.
- New care homes and centres will be evaluated in central Brandbergen.



Principal goals

The map illustrates an overview of the areas that are planned for priority during future development based on the guidelines.

The principal goal is to improve the link between Brandbergen and Handen, increase accessibility to green areas, increase well-being and welfare, change the traffic routes to city streets and renovate the centre of Brandbergen.
